

Become an Assistant or Associate Professor in Pediatric Audiology

- Actively teaching courses within the professional master's program in audiology and research programs in speech and hearing sciences, using various methods and pedagogical formats;
- Developing an active and productive research program in pediatric audiology, focusing on areas such as computational audiology (AI, machine learning), neurological development of the auditory system, or audiological rehabilitation for individuals with hearing difficulties. You will also be expected to secure independent funding from federal granting agencies;
- Supervising postdoctoral trainees and graduate students in speech-language pathology and audiology sciences or other fields within interdisciplinary or intersectoral collaborations;
- Enhancing the visibility of audiology within scientific and professional communities through conferences, scientific publications, and the organization of major scientific events, as well as through community partnerships;
- Actively contributing to the academic life of the audiology program and the Faculty of Medicine, as well as CRA-CHUSJ, by participating in various committees and working groups to strengthen institutional engagement.

What you'll need to succeed

- Hold a doctorate in audiology or a related field;
- Have postdoctoral research training or demonstrate experience as an independent researcher;
- Possess significant experience and a strong track record of productivity in your area of expertise;
- Demonstrate excellence in university teaching and mentoring graduate students;
- Demonstrate an ability to develop internal, national, and international collaborations;
- Exhibit ambition, dynamism, and a strong desire to collaborate;
- Adequate proficiency in the French language or a strong commitment to mastering the proficiency level required upon assuming the position in accordance to **Université de Montréal's Language Policy.** A French language learning assistance program is offered to all professors who wish to acquire French language skills or enhance their communication abilities.

- Description of your research program (two pages);
- A copy of your diplomas;
- The names and addresses of three (3) individuals who can provide reference letters.
